A physician, hospital, clinic or employer must report known or suspected cases of occupational diseases or workplace aggravated health conditions to the Michigan Department of Licensing & Regulatory Affairs. Under Part 56 of P.A. 368 of 1978, the report is to be filed within 10 days after the discovery of the disease or condition on a form furnished by LARA. These forms can be obtained from LARA, Michigan Occupational Safety & Health Administration (517) 284-7740.
